MSC defends its process for review of Fraser River sockeye

Recently the Marine Stewardship Council (MSC) has come under attack from the Raincoast Conservation Foundation which questioned the process and methodology of the MSC certification process (still ongoing) involving the Fraser River sockeye salmon fishery in British Columbia. In an article on The Huffington Post Chris Ninnes, Deputy CEO, Marine Stewardship Council, defends the process by which the MSC is reviewing Fraser River sockeye with a view to ecocertification. Ninnes contends that the process is open and transparent and the methodology is an independent, third-party assessment against MSC's three core principles covering: health of the stock; impact on the ecosystem; and the management of the fishery.
