

An \$8 billion investment annually in rebuilding and ‘greening’ the world’s fisheries could both increase fish catches and generate \$1.7 trillion in long-term economic returns over the next four decades, according to a new United Nations report. An influx to the fishing sector – with funding being covered by scaling down or phasing out the nearly \$30 billion worth of subsidies in place currently – is needed to curb the excess capacity of the world’s fishing fleets while supporting workers in alternative livelihoods, says the Green Economy report.
