According to WorldWatch Vital signs, total global fish production, including wild capture and aquaculture, rose to approximately 159 million tons in 2008. Aquaculture, after growing steadily for the last four decades, now contributes nearly half of the fish produced worldwide and is expected to catch up to wild capture by 2012. Global per capita fish consumption has increased steadily from an average of 9.9 kilograms in the 1960s to an average of 14.4 kilograms in the 1990s and 17.1 kilograms in 2009.
