

Whaling Talks Reach Impasse

Three years of talks aimed at reducing whaling activity by Japan, Norway and Iceland broke down Wednesday. Delegates at the IWC were trying to work out a plan proposed by the United States and other anti-whaling nations to let Japan, Norway and Iceland conduct whaling expeditions, but under tight international control and at significantly lower numbers. Japan blamed the failure of the talks on countries that refused to accept the killing of even a single animal and is now threatening to leave the IWC.
