Turtle Eggs To Be Moved From Oily Beaches In Massive Relocation

An attempt to save thousands of sea turtle hatchlings from dying in the oily Gulf of Mexico is being undertaken in a desperate effort to keep an entire generation of threatened species from vanishing. About 70,000 turtle eggs in up to 800 nests buried in the sand across Florida Panhandle and Alabama beaches will be collected and transported in Styrofoam containers to a temperature-controlled warehouse at Florida's Kennedy Space Center.
