

The tenth meeting of the Conference of the Parties to the Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD COP 10), which gathered 17,000 people from more than 193 countries, was held in Nagoya, Japan from 18 to 29 October 2010. According to Dr. Biliانا Cicin-Sain, Co-chair of the Global Oceans Forum, the agreements reached in Nagoya, which include 20 targets to protect biodiversity in the coming decade and a protocol on access and benefit-sharing, are being hailed as historic achievements in the protection of biodiversity.
